



Taylor Sanitarium

The Sanitarium was constructed by Dr. Wendemeyer, who purchased the land from Dr. Doak. Wendemeyer hired Mamie Rusch, who became the sole owner and operator of the sanitarium after Wendemeyer died in 1936.

Max Eikel's Home, Later Rusch's Home


Max Eikel purchased land from Doak and constructed the home in the 1890s, after the creation of Doak's Addition to the City of Taylor. Mamie Rusch purchased the home in 1954, after she became the owner of the Taylor Sanitarium.




Eikel-Prewitt Building

The Eikel brothers, Max and Paul, took over the family's hardware store in Taylor. By 1893 they were able to buy the Melasky Drug Store property and construct their namesake building.

Melasky House

Home to drugstore owner, Melasky, who maintained his business through the late 1950's. The Melasky family can be traced throughout Central Texas and beyond. Harris Melasky opened a Taylor-based law practice with former governor Moody.

Former T.W. Marse Home

The home of local businessman TW Marse was demolished, but his legacy of starting and supporting local businesses lives on throughout Taylor's downtown. One of his most successful businesses was the T.W. Marse Department Store.

First Presbyterian Church

The church was designed and built by local Williamson County architect, Henry Struve, who also designed the Eikel-Prewitt building.

Moody Museum

Home to a young Dan Moody, who became Texas Governor in 1927 and served until 1931. Before governorship, Moody opened a law practice with Harris Melasky, of the Melasky. Moody retired in Austin and lived there until his death.
